Ahiman Rezon, written by Laurence Dermott in 1764, was the Book of Constitutions for the Antients Grand Lodge, a ritual that is still in wide usage. The title was derived from three Hebrew words, "ahim", "manah", and "raizon". But, what does the term mean?

At different times it has been interpreted as: A Help to a Brother; Faithful Brother Secretary; Will of Selected Brethren; Law of Prepared Brethren; Secrets of a Prepared Brother; Royal Builder; and The Thoughts or Opinions of a True and Faithful Brother.
