The Emulation Rite was created in 1813 by Peter Gilkes, the Emulation Rite claims a direct line from the most ancient Rituals in operative Freemasonry. It gets its name from the Lodge of "Emulation of Improvement" which met for the first time in October 1823 in Freemason's Hall in London. Introduced into France in 1925, it was adopted by several Lodges of the Grand National Lodge of France and in Switzerland by several Lodges of the Grand Lodge of Switzerland Alpina. One of the peculiarities of this Rite is that it is practised in all the first three degrees completely orally; the ceremonies are spoken by heart; this practice is handed down from the time when, as well as the Companions in operative Freemasonry, the Rituals were learnt by heart, with the idea of safe guarding the secrets of the trade, nothing at all should be written down Source: Brother Jerry Estruth describing his English ritual Lodge in Columbia.

Last week was a busy one for the Bryant family, with many late-afternoon activities. One each day, she served a different hors d'oeuvre and a different dinner. From the information provided determine the activity on each day (Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday), as well as the hors d'oeuvre and the main course (one was soup and sandwiches) served on that day (Note: Sunday is the first day of the week)

1. The Bryant's snacked on cocktail frank three days after they enjoyed raw vegetables with dip.
2. The Bryant's attended choir practice the day after they munched on stuffed celery.

3. Nachos were the appetizer two days after the main course was macaroni and cheese.
4. Bowling was latter in the week than the cocktail franks were served, but at least one day before the flounder dinner.
5. The Bryant's went shopping twice, and one of their shopping trips was on either Friday or Saturday. They ate baked chicken for dinner earlier in the week than either shopping trip.
6. The ballet was two days before the steak dinner.
  - a. The days concerned in order are Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday (Given). The vegetables had to be served on Sunday, Tuesday, or Wednesday (Clue 1) so they could not have been served on either Friday or Saturday. It also follows that the franks could not have been served on Sunday.
  - b. Choir Practice had to se on either Wednesday or Saturday (Clue 2) so it could not have been on Sunday, Tuesday, or Friday. It follows that the celery had to have been eating on either Tuesday or Friday eliminating the other three days. (Clue 2)
