Puzzle: (March 10: Nobody sent in a solution so instead of running a new puzzle I will continue to run the same puzzle with additional clues. Last week was a busy one for the Bryant family, with many late-afternoon activities. On several days, to make waiting for dinner easier, Ms. Bryant served hors d'oeuvre (one day she served cheese and crackers) while the main course was cooking. One each day, she served a different hors d'oeuvre and a different dinner. From the information provided determine the activity on each day (Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday), as well as the hors d'oeuvre and the main course (one was soup and sandwiches) served on that day (Note: Sunday is the first day of the week)

1. The Bryant's snacked on cocktail frank three days after they enjoyed raw vegetables with dip.
2. The Bryant's attended choir practice the day after they munched on stuffed celery.
3. Nachos were the appetizer two days after the main course was macaroni and cheese.

4. Bowling was latter in the week than the cocktail franks were served, but at least one day before the flounder dinner.
5. The Bryant's went shopping twice, and one of their shopping trips was on either Friday or Saturday. They ate baked chicken for dinner earlier in the week than either shopping trip.
6. The ballet was two days before the steak dinner.
 - a. The days concerned in order are Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday (Given). The vegetables had to be served on Sunday, Tuesday, or Wednesday (Clue 1) so they could not have been served on either Friday or Saturday. It also follows that the franks could not have been served on Sunday.
 - b. Choir Practice had to be on either Wednesday or Saturday (Clue 2) so it could not have been on Sunday, Tuesday, or Friday. It follows that the celery had to have been eaten on either Tuesday or Friday eliminating the other three days. (Clue 2)
 - c. Nachos could have only been served on Tuesday or Friday (Clue 3) and the Macaroni and Cheese had to have been served on either Sunday or Wednesday
 - d. ASSUMPTION: At this point we are going to take a guess but if we guess wrong everything from this point onward may also be wrong. We have established that franks could not have been served on Sunday (clue a), neither was celery (clue b) nor Nachos (clue c) this leaves with either Cheese & Crackers or Vegetable being served on Sunday. Since Cheese & Crackers are only mentioned in the narrative but Vegetable is mentioned in Clue 1, we are going to assume vegetables (50/50 shot) were served on Sunday and this eliminates vegetables being served on any other day and it also means the franks were served on Wednesday (Clue 1) and eliminates all other days. It then follows that the Cheese & Crackers must have been served on Saturday since all other appetizers have already been eliminated for Saturday (Clues a,b,c,d) which eliminates all other days. Since franks were served on Wednesday (clue d) they must have bowled on Friday and had Flounder on Saturday (Clue 4) eliminating other dinner choices. Since we know they bowled on Friday (Clue d) they must have shopped on Saturday (Clue 5) Choir practice had to be on Wednesday as it the only open date (clues b,d) which means the celery was served on Tuesday (Clue 2) leaving only Saturday for the day Nachos were served. At this point all the appetizers are accounted for
 - e. We know what the activities were for Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday so the ballet must have been on Sunday (Clue 6) leaving only Tuesday for the other shopping day. This accounts for all the activities, leaving only discover the main meals. Steak was eaten on Tuesday (Clues e, 6) so macaroni and cheese was served on Wednesday (Clue 3). We have established that the shopping days were Tuesday and Saturday (Clues d, e) so chicken was served on Sunday (Clue 5) and leaves on Friday for soup and sandwiches. Everything fits and is consistent with the given so we have reached a final solution

Tomorrow we will start a new puzzle
