The Return of the Masonic Daily Spam:

Last March I stopped publishing The Daily Spam because I was appointed to the Grand Lodge Web Page Committee and that it a beautiful site at [www.azmasons.org](http://www.azmasons.org) with its own calendar. Unfortunately the calendar does not work as expected in that it doesn't allow the lodges to update their own calendar. This is because of certain security issues between the calendar system and the people who control our web page. This problem will eventually be solved but in the meantime I am going to go back to my original calendar [www.ArizMasons.org/calendar](http://www.ArizMasons.org/calendar) and based on the information contained in that calendar I will again start notifying you of Masonic events in Southern Arizona, the day of the event, the day before the event, and two days before the event.

Some people consider these daily reminders as spam and if you wish I will remove you from my mailing list; just ask me to so. I would suggest that you continue on the mailing list and simply use your DELETE key if the daily message does not interest or pertain to you in that way will be reminded of an upcoming event that might otherwise slip your mind. In addition to the daily reminders, I will try to entertain you with Masonic Trivia, Quotes and Puzzles.

In my opinion member of the Masonic Families tend to be poor communicators, among ourselves and especially among the general public. This project is a labor of love to help rectify part of that communication problem. It hopes to promote greater participation amongst our members and that it will also encourage visitation by informing our subscribers of Masonic events in a timely and entertaining manner. The events here are primarily focused on southern Arizona events although this newsletter goes out to 543 people worldwide. It is hoped that people in other area will start publishing their own area E-newsletter.

It will take me a few days to get up to speed with my calendar as I depend on you to supply me with the information concerning your meetings. If you see that I made a mistake or that I omitted a meeting please let me know as soon and I will correct it.
